Happy Birthday!

What do you do with a risen savior? Our Easter season sermon series is about following the risen Christ, and being the disciples of the Church of the risen Christ. But if we're following, where is Jesus leading us? Some might say that's a matter for personal discernment and it's different for every person. I suggest that while the particulars may be different for each person and each congregation, the general answer can be confidently affirmed: Beyond where I am now. Beyond where we are now.

We've talked in recent worship services about early disciples following Jesus beyond the political norms and demands of their day, out of the religious preoccupation, out of "obvious" dietary customs and patterns of social interaction and into an entirely new family of God. If the early church learned nothing else by following the risen Christ, it learned that God is much bigger than my/our familiar political world, economic interest, religious preferences, comfortable social circles, ethnic identity and cultural world view.

I've often asked myself, or had other people ask me something like this: "Why don't we spend more time, money and effort on the many needs right here, before we go all around the world?" To me the answer always seems to come to this: Because Christ calls us beyond our own community, people and culture—always. And because I need my sisters brothers and cousins in faith at least as much as they will ever need me.

If I've never met the risen Christ in my Zambian, or Peruvian, or Filipino, or [different than me] brother or sister...then I "know" a reduced Christ and a relatively paltry fellowship in a diminished world. It is when my familiar world is opened that I see how far beyond it God is and how far beyond it God invites me to follow. This is why sustained and fruitful local ministry so often goes hand in hand with a global and cross-cultural experience of God. When I allow God to crash the walls of my familiar, I recognize and partner with a much bigger God in my everyday life.

Don't worry...we don't do this on our own power—we can't! That's why Jesus promised the disciples they would follow him BY THE POWER THAT WOULD BE GIVEN FROM "ABOVE."

**Sunday, May 15th is Pentecost Sunday. Please plan to join us for one of the worship services as we celebrate the "birthday" of the church and the reception of the gift of the spirit. Please WEAR RED**, to symbolize the tongues of fire the began to spread that day as disciples followed the risen Lord to the ends of the earth. Our interactive message will be "Wind Blows, Fire Spreads" but I promise it'll be more than a lot of hot air!:) See you the Sundays before then, and see you that day!

## **Clerk's Corner**

### **From the Session Meetings in April**

#### **Ecclesiastical Business**

- ◆ Praying should be a part of our everyday life. As a part of the Devotional Period, Dr. Henderson again drew the Session into a time of individual and group prayer. Sharing prayers gives us a way to share concerns and encouragement for each other.
- ◆ It was announced at the recent meeting of the Presbytery of Elizabeth of which we are a part, that our Session was 'In Concurrence' with an overture of "Confrontation of HIV and AIDS Globally" that is going to the General Assembly. The importance of continuing to focus on this world-wide mission was stressed. Ruling Elder Barbara Ringk reiterated the rationale for the overture.
- ◆ While you are reading this we are hosting a conference for representatives from Zambia, Zimbabwe, and Mozambique. While the representatives from Zambia are in Westfield we will be moving forward with reinforcement of our partnership agreement with the church in Livingstone, Zambia.
- ◆ The Saturday Evening Service will be suspended from Memorial Day through Labor Day.
- ◆ Session approved a change to the name of a Commission from "Christian Education" to "Faith Formation". This fits with the emphasis on rebuilding faith as a cornerstone of Christian Education. The rationale brought to the Session was "In keeping with our revised mission to help develop the faith of our congregation through both education and service initiatives, we feel that 'Faith Formation' better reflects our goals and communicates our methods."

#### **Administrative business**

- ◆ The Congregational Nominating Committee's suggested minor changes to their procedures were approved by the Session.
- ◆ We welcome Donald Boos who has agreed to serve as our Temporary Music Director.
- ◆ Our Stewardship Commission and Treasurer have put into place an on-line giving cell phone application (app) known as "GIVELIFY" that allows another way to contribute.
- ◆ The Presbytery of Elizabeth is seeking candidates for positions on the Committee on Ministry, the Board of Trustees, the Committee on Preparation for Ministry, the Nominating Committee, the Personnel Committee, and the Permanent Judicial Commission. If any of you feel the call to use your talents on any of these committees, please contact the Clerk.

### **Westfield Leader Article About Amani Youth Band**

Emma Stierhoff and Siobhan Quinlan, two teens from The Presbyterian Church in Westfield (PCW), love music and had a dream to share and use their talents for a worthy cause. Encouraged by Kevin Wilkin, Director of Music for the wired4worship contemporary ministry at the church, the girls founded a musical group called Amani. On Saturday, March 26, they produced and performed a concert to benefit Agape Community Kitchen in Elizabeth.



What started as a performing duo has grown to include as many as 15 teens at any given performance. Amani, which is Swahili for “peace,” performs from time to time at the 9:45 a.m. Sunday services in Westminster Hall at 140 Mountain Avenue. Amani’s musical style, according to violinist and vocalist Catherine King, is “eclectic and covers several different genres, including pop, indie rock and classic rock.”

Amani recently shared their passion for music at Westfield High School’s Folio Coffee House. After that, the girls decided they wanted to use the group’s musical talents at a solo event. During the Saturday afternoon concert, students who have volunteered at the Elizabeth Community kitchen spoke of what it has meant to them to participate on Wednesday afternoons. PCW, led by youth minister the Rev. Amanda Huels, sends weekly, a group of youth and adults to the Agape Community Kitchen at the First Presbyterian Church in Elizabeth to provide a hot meal to food deprived people. Agape means Christian love and that’s what this musical group portrays although their music is not overtly Christian.



The song “Everybody” by Ingrid Michaelson, which was performed by the two originators of the group, have lyrics that speak of the universal need for love. Many of the arrangements for the brass ensemble were done by Ms. Stierhoff, a senior at Westfield High School, who played the guitar, ukulele, piano and clarinet at the event. She is not the only performer who showed versatility. Michael Hauge, Jack Ritter, Matt Gaudin, Sarah Boyle, Catherine King, Austin Chen and Mark Kostyack played multiple instruments throughout the concert.

At the concert’s end, Ms. Stierhoff explained to the audience the challenges of getting all the teens together for rehearsals. “Members in Amani are involved in many after school activities, so that was difficult for us to find a time to get together.” She thanked Mr. Wilkin for his willingness to be there at the rehearsals and come to their rescue with technical issues with microphones and speakers.

The afternoon revealed to the parents, friends and members of the church the talent of the teens as well as their passion about giving back to the less fortunate in Union County.



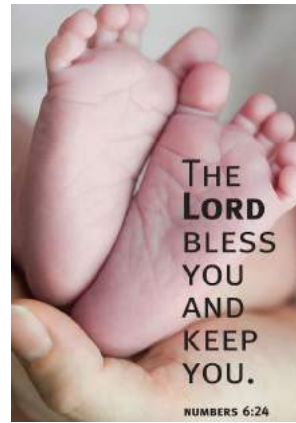

The film is based on the memoir "Travelling to Infinity: My Life with Stephen," by Jane Hawking, and is directed by Academy Award winner James Marsh. It stars Eddie Redmayne and Felicity Jones.

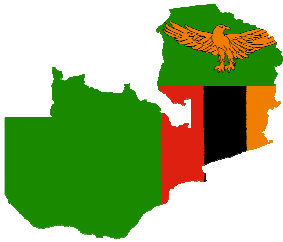

*This is an occasional article to keep you updated on the performances of our professional soloists. Our talented ensemble is very active. If you have a chance you might try to attend one or more of these performances.*

**Cassandra Marie Lambros**, our soprano soloist, will be appearing in a production of Donizetti's opera The Elixir of Love singing the role of Giannetta on April 17th & 23rd for the Eastern Opera Company of New Jersey at the Brooks Arts Center in Bound Brook. Cassandra is also a very accomplished violinist. She will be playing with the Amelia String Quartet, and singing, in concert in our chapel on April 30th at 3PM.

**Sandy Taylor**, our soprano, will be playing the title role in Mary Poppins at Mayo Performing Arts Center, June 3rd through the 5th. She is also singing with the region's premiere professional choir, Kinnara Ensemble in a concert series 'Heartstrings' June 10th through the 12th.

Our tenor soloist, **Jacob Nelson**, is a graduate student at Westminster Choir College. As such he is appearing with several college singing groups: Westminster Choir, Symphonic Choir, Kantorei, Master Singers, and Sacred Music Lab Choir. He has sung with the Berlin Philharmonic in Beethoven's 9th Symphony at Carnegie Hall, with the New York Philharmonic in Handel's Messiah, and with the Philadelphia Orchestra in Mahler's 8th Symphony. He will be singing with Westminster Kantorei, an early music ensemble, April 23rd at 8pm at Princeton University Chapel, and from May 15th through June 9th he will participate in the Spoleto Music Festival in Charleston, South Carolina.

**Mark Cotton**, our bass soloist, will be appearing in Eastern Opera's production of The Elixir of Love as Dr. Dulcamara on April 17th and 24th. He will be the baritone soloist in a performance of Beethoven's 9th Symphony with the Paul Madore Chorale on May 15th in Salem, Massachusetts. He has just been selected to sing the roles of Rigoletto in Verdi's opera Rigoletto for Amore Opera in New York City on May 20th & 25th, and the role of Renato in Verdi's Un Ballo in Maschera for the Atlantic Coast Opera Festival in Philadelphia on June 21st with Maestro Robert MacFarland.

**Matthew Ciufitello**, baritone, who is replacing me in the choir, is the third member of our choir performing in Eastern Opera's production of The Elixir of Love. He will be singing the role of Belcore, the Sergeant. He has just completed a performance of Donizetti's other comic opera Don Pasquale as Dr Malatesta with the New Jersey Light Opera Company. And, he will be singing the role of Papageno in Mozart's Magic Flute in a production at Nyack College in New York.

**Donald Boos** just finished singing Delius' A Mass for Life with the American Symphony Orchestra at Carnegie Hall. I will be singing in a concert of French and American popular song at the Bickford Theater in Morristown on May 15th.
