CLERK'S UPDATE FROM THE MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION

At the Congregational meeting on Dec. 20, changes to Jeremy's terms of call were approved. At that time, several members suggested that we might give Jeremy a one-time bonus to recognize the extraordinary workload and the high quality of work that he has done this past year. In these unprecedented times and due to staff vacancies, he has been doing the work of three ministers.

Gerry Lorenzetti, moderator of Personnel Commission, followed up, consulting with Alan Smith, the treasurer, Gary Zanfagna, moderator of the Stewardship Commission, and me. Gerry then spoke individually with each member of the Personnel Commission informing them of the discussions and asking for their input regarding the bonus. The members of the Personnel Commission unanimously approved this motion: "To award Jeremy Jinkins a one -time bonus of \$10,000. The bonus will be funded from the surplus funds in the Personnel Commission's 2020 budget."

In his discussion with Gerry, Alan noted that under a change in the budgeting and spending policy approved by the Session last May, Session does not have to vote on the bonus. The new policy allows commissions to spend within their approved budgets, but Session should be told of any expenditure of more than \$5,000. Session was notified of Personnel's decision.

Gerry and I delivered the check to Jeremy on Wednesday, December 23, 2020. Jeremy was very thankful and appreciative.

Clerk's Corner

The December Session meeting was active with much discussion and we continue to plan for the future of our church. The Session got to meet Tom Kort, our Parish Associate (via Zoom). Jeremy said that in the coming weeks we will be celebrating new members, baptisms, Christmas Eve, and the start of a new year. Jeremy and Tom are working on an educational and programmatic component at the pastoral level to compliment two different sermon series in the new year.

Alan Smith announced that Elizabeth Presbytery awarded PCW two grants totaling \$2,000 to AGAPE to support food insecurity in our area. Liz Miller announced that Agape received a \$10,000 grant from the Hamstra Foundation.

Mission Commission brought a motion to approve the implementation of a PCW Gift Catalogue project. The catalogue will list missions and programs at PCW or that PCW has a working relationship with. People can donate money to support something on the list and receive an honor card that could be given to someone as a gift. This will be a year-round project but will be kicked off during the Christmas season. The motion passed.

The Stewardship Commission has been working with Generis, a consulting firm, for several weeks. Stewardship made the motion "to approve the negotiation of a contract with Generis to perform the assignment of a part-time Generosity Pastor for PCW at the cost of no more than \$50,000 for the purpose and benefit of updating, improving and sustaining our call as a church to deliver on God's call for us to be more effective and good stewards of God's gifts to us". The consultant would work with PCW for a year to provide training, specific tools, and a structured process for inspiring and growing a spirit of generosity throughout the year. The motion passed after many questions and discussion.

Office and Property updated Session on the renovation of a room in Lower Westminster Hall due to water damage. The mold remediation is complete and French drains and sump pump have been installed. An architect has done the drawings. TOPS and the Nursery school will be using this space in early 2021. The motion was made "to allow Office & Property to go forward with the restoration of the room in lower Westminster Hall at a cost of up to \$30,000". The motion passed.

Jeremy was excused from the meeting and the Session went into Executive Session. Gerry Lorenzetti presented the proposed changes in the Terms of Call for Jeremy. The motion was made and seconded to present the Terms of Call for Jeremy Jinkins to the congregation at the Annual Meeting called for 12/20/20 for a vote.

Time Out for Parents, our Church sponsored preschool program for children younger than three years, is planning to resume Monday, January 4, 2021! The COVID virus will make the final decision for us, but plans are underway to have children who will be 2.5 years before February attend on Monday and Wednesday mornings in room 105. The class or self contained "pod" will have no more than ten children and cost approximately \$45 for each 2.5 hour session. 

A slate of nominees is created from the reviewed candidates and is presented for election at the March Congregational meeting. The term starts in May.
