Clerk's Corner

Highlights of the April 13, 2021 Session Meeting

There was a lot of information shared at this month's meeting.

• In person Gathering

Jeremy said that in person gathering was originally planned to start during Lent but there was no decline in Covid cases. Vaccine rates are increasing so hopefully the case numbers will decline. As long as Covid restrictions are in place, any worship service we add will be a supplement to the online 10 am service.

Outdoor in person Sunday 12 Noon worship is scheduled to start on 418/21- depending on the weather. This service will be completely different from the 10am regular service.

• Coordinated Technology Project

Jeremy asked Martha Kieczykowski to coordinate the several independent projects that are currently in progress.

Martha's goal is that each project has a clear understanding of how their project enables PCW to meet our vision and mission.

She will be working with the project leaders in setting the PCW priorities, merging timelines (which will overlap), and facilitating communications between projects and leadership.

She presented a summary of the current projects and the names of the project leads. She asked if anyone knows of people with the specific skills that would be beneficial to any of the projects to please let her know.

Martha explained one of the documents deals with the governance structure. In particular, Session's role is to approve project deliverables, prioritize as needed among the projects and authorize the spending of money.

Session Updates

I. Treasurer Update:

Alan Smith reported that we have received approval of a second PPP loan in the amount of \$327,000. This will be split with 60% going to the PNS&K and 40% going to the church.

Alan asked the Session to reflect on the 2020 financial numbers. We had a strong, positive return on investments in 2020. He has a meeting tomorrow afternoon with the Auditors to hear suggestions on improving our budget/accounting processes. Jeremy thanked Alan for all the time he spent of applying for the loans. The loans have made a huge difference to PNS&K.

II. Personnel Update:

Gerry Lorenzetti reported that a committee of Faith Formation and Personnel will be interviewing a candidate for a part-time, interim CE Educator.

Gerry reported that Tina Barulli will be retiring. She will be staying to help with the transition. Gerry has put together a committee of Glenn DuMont, David Foltz, Liz Miller, Alan Smith, and Lou Ann to work on evaluating the position and researching the different ways of staffing the position.

III. Church Management System:

Laure Park & Liz Miller said that the reevaluation of the "data base" will now be called the "Church Management System" project. Laure said that "thanks" to Erik's suggestions they have seen demos of three systems. The front runner is a cloud based, app system. They are still doing reference checks. This system fully integrates everything but does not have a financial package. Our options are to stay with ACS or switch to a program such as Quick Books. There will be lots of process changes. There currently is no timeline and it will take much work to implement a new system.

IV. Confirmand Examination and APNC Update:

Courtney Nemec said there had been a communication problem about the timing of Confirmation. Courtney and Jeremy met with Mason Gibbs to do the course work. He completed his Faith Statement and met with Courtney, Lisa Black, Pam Shaw, and Jeremy to be examined on April 6, 2021. He will be recognized with the other 2020 Confirmands in a service with a date to be determined.

Courtney reported that the APNC's are having lots of great conversations. Both teams meet regularly to share information and candidate information. Courtney asked for continued prayers.

V. Office and Property Update:

Mike Quinlan reported that there was a recent 24-inch water problem in the Choir Rehearsal room. They are still not sure where the leak came from. The good news is the room will be redesigned so that its use can be more flexible.

The building permits for Lower Westminster Hall were approved by the Town. Work will start on 4/30/21.

A request for approval for spending money on the lighting in the Sanctuary will be coming soon. O&P have a meeting scheduled with Somerset Media to see the product. The current system is outdated.

The walkway on the front lawn leading to East Broad Street will have the antique slates re-laid.

- 1. Correspondence Received/Sent:
 - a. Correspondence with Garrett Falzone about their move to California. He and his wife will remain active at PCW until they will find a church to transfer their membership. They will remain active at PCW until 12/31/21 at the latest.
 - b. Received an email from Deirdre Gelinne, Westfield United Fund Executive Director, stating they have decided to look for office space in an area that is centrally located and accessible to the public. She thanked PCW for considering providing them office space.
 - c. Received an email from Jeremy that he had contact with Dawn Mackey who let him know that the Westfield leaders have approached Streetworks (the company developing the Lord & Taylor property) about redeveloping the municipal side of the walk located in front of our church, linking Mindowskin and Mountain Ave. along Broad Street. This information will be shared with the Task Force looking at the plan for the front lawn.
 - d. Jeremy received a request from Lisa Fraeble at Morristown PC asking for a reference on Somerset Media who they are considering using to investigate streaming services. Mark Fleder connected with her.
 - e. Received a letter from Kueichu Hsu. She gave a donation of \$1,000 for the Revitalization Cemetery Committee at PCW commemorating the se second anniversary of her husband's passing.

Administrative Business:

- a. **Motion:** Rev. Jinkins made the motion "To elect Howard Adams and Pam Shaw to represent Session at the Presbytery meeting on Saturday, 5/8/21 from 9-11 am via Zoom." **The motion passed unanimously.** Barbara McLaughlan and Jeremy Jinkins also plan to attend this meeting. Jeremy encouraged all Session members to attend and learn more about the new Presbytery. He said that PCW should take a leadership role at Presbytery as they have in the past.
- b. The Presbytery of Northeast New Jersey's meeting dates for the rest of the year are 5/8/21, 9/11/21 and 11/13/21 at 9 am. All are on Saturdays so there is no longer a conflict with our Session meetings.

While we cannot do that in person this year, we would like to share our newest honorees. Congratulations to those who joined our church during 1971 and continue to be members!

New Golden Anniversary Members:

Leslie A. Bischoff: She is a lifelong resident of Westfield. Her late parents, Jane and Barton Bischoff, were active in our church and Leslie still has the Bible she received when she was in the second grade. She became a member as a Confirmand. Now 65, Leslie was a veterinary technician early in her career and then spent 20 years as an X-ray mammography technician for a private imaging company in Morristown. Her hobbies are many: She enjoys knitting, playing the flute and has taken hiking trips to many parts of the United States.

Fran Faltermayer: Born in Charleston, W. Va., Fran was working for a small publishing company in New York when she met her future husband, Ed, who had a long career as an editor and writer with the Wall Street Journal and Fortune magazine. They were married in 1967 and lived in Brooklyn, N.Y., before moving to Westfield three years later. Their two children, Steven and Charlotte, grew up in the PCW. Their three children, Elizabeth, Peter and Matthew, went to Sunday School at PCW. Now 89, Audrey did volunteer work at the Westfield Service League and at Overlook and Children's Specialized hospitals before she and her late husband moved to Fellowship Village in 2010.

Carol Fredericks: She grew up in Roselle Park and was raised as a Methodist. She met her future husband, Bill, a long-time active member of PCW, on a blind date in 1962 and they were married at our church by the Rev. Jim Cole in 1967. Carol, now 75, was an administrative assistant at an accounting firm in New York City before starting their family. Their two daughters, Allison and Susan, grew up in our church and Susan continues to be involved with the youth groups. Bill has served on a number of boards of directors. They live in Scotch Plains.

Gail Kender: With long-time ties to Westfield, Gail, 64, joined PCW as a Confirmand. She and her husband, Richard, were married at PCW in 1979 by the Rev. Dr. Richard E. Craven, who had also married her parents, Richard and Janet Hartkopf, in 1954 in Elizabeth. Gail and Richard's two children, Brian and Meredith, both were confirmed in our church. Gail and Richard, now retired, spend their time between homes in Vero Beach, Fl., and Mantoloking, N.J.

Jim Pinkin: A semi-retired sales and marketing executive, Jim now lives in Naples, Fla. He grew up in Garwood and received a BS from Fairleigh Dickenson University and an MBA from Seton Hall University. He formerly was an executive at CCG Marketing Solutions and Freedom Meditech. He and his late wife, Lois, had four sons: Jeff, Steven, Brett and Drew (Jeff and Steven live in Westfield and are current members of PCW). Notes from the Presbytery of Northeast NJ Meeting

March 13, 2021

Meeting started at 9:00 a.m. with the Installation of the new Moderator – Rev. Dr. Wanda Lundy and the Vice Moderator – Rev. Kirk Woodward.

The new logo for the Presbytery was introduced – it is in "Presbyterian blue" and is a combination of three crosses symbolizing the joining of the three Presbyteries.

Nominations were presented by the Vision team – a group of twelve members who reflect a cross-section of all three presbyteries. The twelve candidates were approved.

Nominations for the leadership positions were presented – Co-Leaders were offered – Steve Houston (from the Newton Presbytery – in ministry since 1997) and Jeremy Campbell (from the Elizabeth Presbytery – in ministry since 2003) – they will serve a three year term that can be renewed. There was extensive discussion regarding the fact that the leadership team does not reflect the diversity of the Presbytery. There were 34 PIFS received – 19 males, 15 females; the committee heard 11 of the prospects preach; 6 candidates were interviewed; the position was offered to two candidates and they accepted. The nominations were accepted and their terms of call approved.

Rev. Dr. Alonzo Johnson gave the homily on John 3:14-21 – through Jesus there is hope in difficult times; we are called to raise the healing staff in the world – in our work, in our churches. We need to lift our hands and prayers to support those who need to see the hope of Christ. Be open to God's call to lift up Jesus in a place of hopelessness. The church should be the place of healing and hope and love.

Report on Giving – The Presbytery is working with CASA – providing gift cards for foster children ages 16-21 who are under CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) supervision; NJ Reentry Corporation – providing survival kits, training, assistance to those coming out of prisons; United Community Corporation – food for food pantries.

Report on Learning - Self Development of People – committee addressing reparations; racial inequality and creating opportunity. The church has been historically been effective in working within communities to meet the needs of people. This group receives funds from One Great Hour of Sharing.

PCW's Parkinsons Group Walk Around the Park

The Westfield Parkinson Support Group gathered in person for the first time in over a year on Monday, April 19. The combined Westfield and Madison groups have been meeting virtually via Zoom each week since April 2020. Fifteen fully-vaccinated members took a walk around Mindowaskin Park to raise money and create awareness about Parkinson's Disease. Westfield Mayor, Shelley Brindle, joined us to read a proclamation declaring that April is Parkinson's Disease Awareness month She also walked with the group. It was truly a joy for our group to be able to be together again.

Through our local walk, the team raised over \$1,000 for the Parkinson Unity Walk event, which usually takes place annually in Central Park, NYC, attracting over 10,000 people from around the country each April.

Through virtual meetings, the PD Support group was able to reconnect with members who are no longer able to physically come to meetings due to advancing disease or relocation. Members from

Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and Somerset have been able to attend our virtual meetings and even join the walk via FaceTime! As we are now able to think about meeting in person again, virtual meetings will continue to be an important part of being a connected community of support for people with Parkinson's and their care partners.


Thank you for your continued prayers, donations and many contributions to this ministry. FISH changes lives and has been able to continue through these trying times.
