# Clerk's Corner

## Highlights of the October 12, 2021 Session Meeting

### Moderator's Report

Rev. Jinkins talked about continuing the work we have been doing for the past two years. With Marcy, Sara, and Krista we are fully staffed. He explained that the Organizational Task Force developed the three-pastor model but did not want "siloes ministries." The ministry teams are aligned and will work together. We are investing in the future with staff and technology. We are "leaning into what we are becoming." The hard work done in the past is paying off. Jeremy asked everyone to get to know Marcy and Sara. They need to know what we think and to build relationships. The Deacons will be aligned with the Ministry teams in the future. There will be church wide fellowship led by Marcy including Adult Faith Formation. The Youth, Children, and AGAPE will be under Sara. Engagement of future members will be under both Associate Pastors. Jeremy thanked the Session for pledging early.

### Session Updates:

1. Mission Invitation to Visit Agape Local- Ethan Harris said that Carole Cook is inviting all Elders and Deacons to stop in on Fridays from 9-12p (she is happy to meet another time if Fridays are not convenient) to see what they do in the Robinson Room. They are happy to explain it so we will have some understanding about the need in our community. Ethan said the AGAPE Clothing Drive is 10/20 and 10/21/21. He said St. Helen's had been spearheading making sandwiches and we had been participating in the Backpack program before Covid. They would like to make these long-term programs and Mission Commission is looking into this. Year-to-date \$25,000 has been raised for Local Agape. Mission Commission wants to provide opportunities to do "hands on" mission in the future. FISH has been housing guests in hotels but hopes to restart rotating shelters.
2. Generosity - Bill Tittle said the pledge drive has changed tone and approach. There was a mini-generosity training program on 9/29/21. He thanked "Communications and Laure Park for the multimedia support. Several personal testimonies are being videoed. Pledge Sunday is 10/24/21. There will be a small celebration out front after the services. Follow up mailings will go out and there will be report to the Congregation on 11/14/21. Bill thanked all the Elders for pledging and said that giving is up 9% so far.
3. Office and Property –Michael Quinlan
  - a. Michael reported that work has started on the Nursery School roof.
  - b. The driveway repair has been under discussion for about 4 years. The driveway will be reengineered. Michael made the following motion: **Motion #2: "Office and Property requests approval to spend up to \$175,000 for the replacement of the parking lot, driveway and associated work". The motion was unanimously approved.**
  - c. Michael gave an update on the Technology Transformation Team saying they have been meeting each week working on the Wi-Fi internet, live streaming, and a mobile cart to be used in hybrid (in-person and on-line) meetings. The team decided to use an open platform instead of a specific brand such as Zoom. Nancy Smith said that they used a demo cart for the Worship Commission meeting, and it worked well. Additional carts could be purchased in the future, if needed. Michael made the following motion: **Motion #3: "Office and Property requests approval to spend up to \$7,500 to purchase one mobile media cart for hybrid meetings". The motion was unanimously approved.**
4. Budget - Liz Miller/Alan Smith/Gerry Lorenzetti-
  - a. Liz Miller discussed the process Youth Commission used to prepare next year's budget. They thought about what "could be" rather than "what was done in the past". Some items were consolidated. They discussed Mission trips and arrived at a budget of \$14,000. The Youth Rebuilding Hope endowment currently has \$70,00. These dollars will be used to augment the Youth budget.

- b. Alan thanked everyone for their work on the budget and asked that everyone have a draft budget to him by 10/15/21. We will be voting on the budget at the November Session meeting. Jeremy suggested simplifying the Income and Balance sheet where possible. Please review all line items to see if they are still needed.
- c. Gerry Lorenzetti- There will be some major adjustments to the Personnel budget for next year. The line item for “Cost of Moving” will go to “\$0”. The Custodial staff salaries will increase. Custodial staff salaries have been low in the past. Compared to other custodial positions. There have been discussions about bringing the custodian pay up to a living wage. The living wage for Union County is \$16.04/hour. Personnel is looking to increase the fulltime wage to \$16.50/hour and the part-time wage to \$14.50/hour. Public sector custodians are paid more but they pay for part of their healthcare plan. PCW pays the health insurance in full. We now have three fulltime pastors. Tom Kort’s position will end on 12/31/21. He was originally signed on for 7 months and was extended another 6 months. One Director position that is funded by the Carrie Holmes fund is not filled at this time.

## Clerk’s Report

### Omnibus Motion - Approved

1. **Motion #1:**
  - a. *“Approve the minutes of the Special Session meeting to receive new members on September 12, 2021.*
  - b. *“Approve the minutes of the Regular meeting of Session on September 14, 2021.*
  - c. Stewardship approved the following policy: *“In addition to approval of vouchers being made in written form with signature (this is the existing policy), it is now officially permissible for Commission Heads to submit via email voucher information and notice of approval. Commission Heads continue to work under the existing expense policies.”*
  - d. The Clerk of Session *“moves to accept the resignation of Joe Diacheysn from the current Deacon Board according to the Book of Order G-2.0405 Dissolution of Relationship”.* The Book of Order G-2.0405 states *“A ruling elder, or deacon may resign from the session or board of deacons, with the session’s consent”.*
  - e. *“Accept the resignation of Veronica Guevara Carlucci and Brett Carlucci, (children Aiden and Violet Carlucci) as active members at their request.”*
2. Correspondence Received/Sent:
  - a. All three former Presbytery’s Policies on Compensation/Minimum Terms of Call were reviewed. The draft for the Presbytery of Northeast New Jersey is based on the former Elizabeth Presbytery’s version. The draft was shared with Jeremy Jinkins, Gerry Lorenzetti, Alan Smith who had no further input. Churches in the Presbytery are required to comply with the policies and the clergy staff at our church are paid more than the required minimum.
  - b. Sent an email to Session to remind them to send Lou Ann Kaplonski the names of the people on their commission.
  - c. Forwarded information from Stewardship to Session with a reminder to please submit their pledge prior to September 26, 2021 and to send an email to Bill Tittle when their pledge was submitted.
  - d. Received an email from Anita McNamara who forwarded Joe Diacheysn’s email letter of resignation.
  - e. Received an email from Veronica Guevara Carlucci saying they are members of another church and asked that she and her family be removed from membership at PCW.

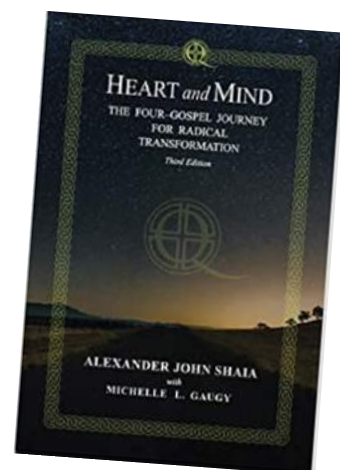
The plan is to offer two meeting times – one during the afternoon and one during the evening. We will try to meet in person but will use Zoom when needed.

# Computers for Beginners

## **Eagle Scout Project to help beginner computer users.**

Peter Nazzaro, Troop 72 Eagle Scout Candidate, created a YouTube channel that features easy to learn technology basics such as: computer security tips, tips for using email, tips for using a web browser, computer software and computer hardware tips.

There are many different ways computers can help you. You can get things delivered for free that are hard to find; access maps and directions, read books with big text from your local library on a tablet, send and receive photos and videos of your children/grandchildren and family, have a video call with a relative on Zoom, Facetime, or Skype, etc., get up to date weather reports, find coupons for purchases.

Some of the questions answered in Peter's videos are: *How do I attach a file to an email? How do I browse the internet safely? How do I know if I'm running low on storage? What is the easiest way to find text on a website? What is the best way to create passwords? How do I create a bookmark?*

Here are a few tips for learning about computers:

- Be patient with yourself and your computer
- Don't be afraid to ask for help
- Humans can help you with you're your computer
- Read directions carefully
- Remember, Computers are tools, they only do what they are instructed to do
