# New Faces at PCW


There are some new faces at PCW, and we couldn't be more pleased and excited about their addition to our pastoral and program staff:

# Clerk's Corner: Highlights of the September 14, 2021 Regular Session Meeting

#### **Moderator's Report**

Rev. Jeremy Jinkins said that we have been working on the vision and mission for the last two years and are in our first year of reinvesting in the infrastructure, both digital and in-person. He asked everyone to work on the budgets over the next month to express each Commission's needs for the next year. He suggested using these questions:

- 1. What is it that your Commission does?
- 2. What do you need to engage people?
- 3. What do you want to achieve?

The budget will be voted on at the November Session meeting. Alan Smith said that he had a conversation with a member who was concerned about the amount of money being spent. Alan said that he explained that we are on an intentional path. The vision/mission is guiding generosity, worship services and the life of the church. He said that member felt much better after hearing about the process we are using.

### Session Updates:

- 1. Worship Commission- Nancy Smith reported that Worship Commission is looking deeper into the elements of worship. There will be an "Invitation to the Life of the Church" time during worship. People will talk about how they are responding to God's call and how it makes them feel more at home in the church. David Seaman and Jessica Cerino will be contacting people to speak at worship services. People can share what they are doing and how it affects their life and faith. The talk should be 2 minutes.
- 2. Faith Formation Update- Jeremy thanked Bill Cook and Krista Aslanian for all the work they have done for Faith Formation.

- 3. Stewardship Update- Bill Tittle reported the Stewardship season is about to begin and that giving has held up well during Covid.
  - The stewardship theme will be "Welcome Home". There will be about 50 people at the Adam's home on Sunday, 9/19/21.
  - Bill said they identified more than 27 activity groups to speak with about generosity. The leaders will be trained and then speak with the groups that they interact with. There will be three training session starting on 9/15/21 and then on the next two Wednesday nights.
  - Videos are being prepared and the communication plan is in place. Bill thanked Laure Park and Communications.
  - Liz Fischer will give an introduction about the Stewardship season in worship on 9/19/21.
  - Bill said the Celebration on the front lawn will be Sunday, 9/26/21 and the rain date will be 10/24/21.
  - Bill asked that all Elders please submit their pledge cards before 9/26/21. They would like to announce that all Session members have pledged on the first day.
  - The pledge cards are in development. A draft was shown to Session and the link can be used for Session to submit their pledges.
  - Bill asked Session to use the "4 P's" when considering what their pledge will be. Prayerful thought on giving; Proportional giving- giving in kind; Pleasing- is what I am giving pleasing to God; and Peacefulness-am I at peace with my gift?
- 4. Stewardship Kick Off Celebration Plans for Front Lawn (9/26/21)-Sara Benedetti said that she and Krista had brainstormed ideas for the Front Lawn celebration. There will be games; activities for children; individual, prepackaged snacks and water bottles. She is working with Beyanka on communications. Volunteers are needed to help. Please contact Sara. A concern was raised about the first "celebration" in months being tied to the Stewardship season. The response was that Stewardship is not about raising money- it is spiritual growth and growing generosity. Jeremy said that in the future the budget process will change and will not be tied to the raising of funds.
- 5. Budget Process- Alan Smith said that the August Financial report will be out shortly. He will provide information about spending over the last 2 years and will share with everyone.
- 6. Technology Transformation Team Update- Martha Kieczykowski said the team in evaluating the needs throughout the campus. They have been meeting weekly since May. They have taken road trips to St. Helen's, which a complete rebuild of the church; Morristown Presbyterian Church, which was a retrofit; and they are still trying to get to Totowa to see the contemporary service space. Mike Quinlan reported that there had been 4 groups for on-site visits. Two RFI's (Request for Information) have been received. One is for Internet connectivity and the other for AV packages. The team has spoken with Nancy Smith's group about room/space usage on the campus. There will be some hybrid rooms and carts with the required equipment that can be moved to rooms as needed.

#### **Clerk's Report**

- 1. Correspondence Received/Sent:
  - a. Received a thank you note from Casey Heintz addressed to Session and all of PCW for being chosen as a recipient for the Van Dellen scholarship. A copy is included in the Session Packet.
- 2. Administrative Business
  - a. The Clerk signed the covenant with Marcy Rudins and forwarded it to Marcy on 8/13/21. Marcy signed it and forwarded it to Bobbie Arrowsmith, Chair Commission on Ministry for The Presbytery of Northeast New Jersey. She signed it and returned a copy of the completely signed covenant on 8/17/21. The final signed copy was forwarded to the Senior Pastor, Church Administrator, Moderator of Personnel, and the Co-Chair of the APNC.
  - b. Bill Cook and Ethan Harris volunteered to represent Session at the Special Meeting of Session on October 10, 2021 at 9:15 am to receive new members.

# **Zambia Update**

We are pleased to tell you the first of the funds for the programs of support for our brothers and sisters in Livingstone have been received by the church and distribution plans are in place with action started. Immediate support includes:

- 50% for the empowerment fund to be shared among the families equally per household.
  - <sup>9</sup> Each household should find a way to sustain their families after getting the funds.
  - <sup>9</sup> All members agreed to start saving which will be helpful to the church activities especially the school and all the members.
  - <sup>9</sup> There will be a training to help on how to start saving and do business.
- The other 50% will go for microfinance which will be a fund for the mini-loans at 5% interest.
- Funds were also received to continue PCW's support of the church's internet connectivity and direct food support for HIV/AIDS victims for whom they provide care.

The above stipulations were arrived at by mutual agreement and insistence among the Livingstone congregation, the synod for Zambia, and a PC(USA) Zambia mission co-worker, to ensure effective use of the funds.

Additional work continues to support further roll-out of the empowerment programs in the immediate future, as the church and synod have suggested the funds will be divested most easily in portions rather than all-at-once. The water sourcing project is in the early stages of vetting service providers and soliciting bids for contracts; information will follow as this develops.

Rev. Sevatt Kabaghe, Synod General Secretary wrote "What a joy when God has granted peace in someone's heart and made a way for the impossible to be possible. ... We are so grateful as a synod for this will be a way to help the sustenance of the work of the Lord in Livingstone." Robert Nkunika, stated clerk of the Livingstone Church, sent the members' deepest heartfelt gratitude to the entire PCW.

The Zambia Mission Team is very grateful for the enormous generosity of our church members and friends. Thank you!

It is time to utilize the lessons we have been learning over the years, and to open a conversation with all seekers to interpret the teaching of Jesus and advance our faith journey.


We hope that you will join us as we walk through the Gospels utilizing the work of a renown Biblical scholar – Alexander Shaia, PhD through his book Heart and Mind: The Four-Gospel Journey for Radical Transformation. Dr. Shaia extensively researched early church history and biblical texts to formulate new insights into the lessons taught through the 4 Gospels.

The walk will be relatively easy as Dr. Shaia does the heavy lifting and presents introductions and interpretations of major passage by major passage using easily accessible language and insights.

The plan is to offer two meeting times – one during the afternoon and one during the evening. We will try to meet in person but will use Zoom when needed.

The meetings will occur on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Mondays of each month: 3-4:30pm and 7:30-9pm starting on Monday, November 1st. The format will be the same for each meeting time and will revolve around assigned readings from Heart and Mind and we will work to thoroughly discuss lessons learned, implications and actions encouraged. 
# **NJFO Outdoor Concert Under the Stars**
